ORDER OF THE CHIEF JUDGE
20-078

WHEREAS, the Court has adopted the Plan for Phased Resumption of Operations ("Reopening Plan") and issued Amended General Order No. 20-08, concerning the phased reopening of the Court;

WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and other public health authorities have advised taking precautions to slow the spread of the COVID-19 virus, also known as "Coronavirus," including recommending the use of face coverings in public settings; and

WHEREAS, Federal Protective Service Commander Jae Jung issued a memorandum requiring face coverings for entry and in all common spaces within the Federal Building at 300 N. Los Angeles Street, effective May 4, 2020;

THEREFORE, in accordance with the Reopening Plan and in order to protect

public health and safety, the Chief Judge orders as follows:

- 1. All individuals, except those who are exempt, seeking entry to, or occupying, the United States Courthouses or Probation and Pretrial Services Offices in the Central District of California must wear face coverings in all spaces. The face covering must completely conceal the individual's nose and mouth at all times. Individuals who are exempt include: children younger than 2 years of age; anyone who has trouble breathing; anyone who is unable to remove the face covering without assistance; and anyone who is unable to wear a face covering due to a medical condition.
- 2. This Order does not apply to the courtrooms and chambers of individual judges. Individual judges will determine the face covering policy for their respective courtrooms and chambers.
- 3. Court employees who are alone in a non-public, private office or workspace, which permits at least six feet of physical distance from others, may temporarily remove their face coverings.
- 4. The United States Marshal, his Deputies, and the Court Security Officers shall enforce this Order and deny entry to individuals not wearing face coverings.
- 5. Individuals who are denied entry will be asked to contact the office or courtroom to be visited to explore alternatives to entering the building.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
