JUDGE SANDRA R. KLEIN'S TENTATIVE RULING PROCEDURES

In most cases, Judge Klein issues tentative rulings by 2:00 p.m. the day before the hearing date. These rulings are generally available via the Court's webPACER service and will appear on the calendars posted outside the courtroom and placed on counsel tables inside the courtroom on the date scheduled for the hearing.

Please note that even if the court has issued a tentative ruling <u>appearances are still</u> <u>required</u> unless:

- 1. The tentative ruling states explicitly that no appearance is required; or
- 2. Judge Klein's chambers or calendar clerk has confirmed that no appearance is necessary.

A moving party's failure to attend a hearing on its motion will result in denial of the motion for failure to prosecute and may result in the issuance of an order to show cause re: sanctions. An opposing party's failure to attend a hearing on a motion that it has opposed will be deemed to have withdrawn its opposition to the relief requested in the motion.
