

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. *When is a matter calendared?*

All motions filed with the court and scheduled for hearing are listed on the calendar, and on the docket for the case or adversary proceeding. WebPACER contains this information.

2. *How can a matter be continued?*

If a motion is unopposed and is not in an adversary proceeding, then a motion to continue with a proposed order must be filed.

If the matter is in an adversary proceeding or is opposed, then a stipulation signed by all parties and a proposed order must be filed.

In any case, no matter is continued unless an order is signed before the hearing, or the tentative ruling indicates that the matter has been continued. In these circumstances, no appearance is required.

3. *Has the judge signed an order?*

The docket contains all orders that have been signed by the judge and entered. webPACER contains this information.

4. *Can the judge's staff search a case docket for a particular matter?*

webPACER contains all docket information. There is no need to contact judge's staff for this information. The judge's staff is busy with other assignments.

5. *What is the tentative ruling on a particular matter scheduled for hearing?*

webPACER contains this information. See also the "Tentative Ruling" topic for further information.
