The motion of creditor, movant Atlanta Postal Credit Union came on for hearing on January 5, 2016 before the Honorable Robert Kwan, United States Bankruptcy Judge. An appearance was made on behalf of plaintiff by Katherine Kane. No other appearances were made.

The Court grants in part plaintiff's motion in the principal loan amount of \$33,503.60 for the reasons stated in the moving papers and for lack of timely written opposition. This amount is a nondischargeable debt pursuant to 11 U.S.C. §§ 523(a)(2)(A) and (a)(6). As stated in its tentative ruling and in its remarks at the hearing, the Court denies the motion in part as to the remaining

amounts requested, the claims for amount above principal amount, \$350.00 in costs, \$2,876.85 in attorneys' fees and prejudgment interest for lack of substantiation since no contractual or statutory basis for such claims is provided. Plaintiff has not submitted a copy of the contract, nor has it cited any statute, for its claims in excess of the principal amount of the loan, which was evidenced by a copy of the loan check. The court also denies the motion in part as to the claims for punitive damages since no specific amount was pleaded in the complaint, and to award on a default judgment would deny procedural due process. *See,* 1 Wagstaffe, *Rutter Group Federal Civil Procedure Before Trial,* ¶ 6:130 *et seq.*, at 6-36 (2015), *citing inter alia,* Fed. R. Civ. P. 54(c) and *Fehlhaber v. Fehlhaber,* 681 F.2d 1015, 1024-1025 (5<sup>th</sup> Cir. 1982).

By separate order, judgment is to be entered in favor of plaintiff Atlanta Postal Credit Union and against defendant, debtor Sasha Lashe Ramsey in the sum of \$33,503.60.
